#### A. Hope in Colossians:

- 1:5 Thank God that believers have HOPE laid up in heaven
- 1:23 Encouragement to cling to the HOPE of the gospel
- 1:27 Jesus Christ, who is the HOPE of glory, is in you
- 3:4 You will appear with Christ when He appears; this hope leads to application
- 3:23-24 You ultimately serve Jesus Christ, knowing (based on hope) about your inheritance

#### B. Hope defined:

•	NT Greek word for hope:Strong's G1680 – noun, from a primary	
	verb $\acute{e}lp\bar{o}$ (to anticipate, usually with pleasure); expectation (abstractly or concretely	y)
	or confidence:—faith, hope.	
•	OT Hebrew word for hope:Strong's H983 – adverb or noun safely	<i>!</i> :-
	assurance, boldly, (without) care(-less), confidence, hope, safe(-ly, -ty), secure, sure	ely
	<ul> <li>Example: Psalm 16:9, quoted in Acts 2:26</li> </ul>

### C. The Jewish hope of eternity
