# Pragmatism: insufficient motivation for spirituality

Pragmatism: I choose to do what works well and gets good results

### A. An approach to spirituality based on Pragmatism: **Spirituality is one thing I do.**

Thought process of pragmatism:

- 1) The pragmatist sees potential \_\_\_\_\_ in doing what God says.
- 2) The pragmatist will \_\_\_\_\_ doing what God says because *I see how it helps me.*

Two problems with pragmatism:

- 1) I cannot \_\_\_\_\_ clearly.
  - Isaiah 55:8-11
  - Proverbs 14:12
- 2) \_\_\_\_\_ will dictate my priorities.
  - Luke 8:14
  - 2 Timothy 4:10
  - Hebrews 12:1

B. An approach to spirituality based on Identity:  
**I am a spiritual being with a connection to God.**

Thought process of identity-based spirituality in Colossians:

- 1) Jesus Christ is worthy of being my \_\_\_\_\_ priority always.
  - Who is He? (Col. 1:15-20)
  - What has He done for me? (Col. 1:21-22, Gal. 2:20)
- 2) I am \_\_\_\_\_ to Jesus Christ.
  - What is my identity? (Col. 2:10-15)
- 3) Therefore, I'll \_\_\_\_\_ Jesus Christ in the way He has taught me, no matter the circumstances.
  - Col. 3:1-4 – Decide to pursue Jesus Christ because He pursued me.
  - Col. 3:5-4:6 – How He has taught me to pursue Him.
