Ephesians 2:8-9 shows the place of good works relative to our eternal salvation:

- o First, eternal salvation is a gift received by faith.
- o Then, good works should follow this is our purpose as saved individuals.

A. Eternal Rewards as a Theme in Scripture

- Matthew 6:1-18 "your Father who sees in secret will Himself reward you openly"
- Matthew 6:19-21 "lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven"
- **Hebrews 6:10** "For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love"
- 1 Corinthians 15:58 "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."
- 1 Corinthians 3:13-14 "each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has built on *it* endures, he will receive a reward."
- 1 Corinthians 4:5 "Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord comes, who will both bring to light the hidden things of darkness and reveal the counsels of the hearts. Then each one's praise will come from God."
- **2 Corinthians 5:10** For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things *done* in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.
- Romans 14:10 "But why do you judge your brother? Or why do you show contempt for your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ."
- **Revelation 22:12** "And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward *is* with Me, to give to every one according to his work."
