## Psalm 1

# A. Purpose of Psalm 1

- Collectively: to introduce the first book of the Hebrew Psalms
- Individually: to facilitate meditation on how a believer can live

### B. Structure of Psalm 1

- A General contrast between righteous and ungodly present tense (v1)
  - B Dwelling of the righteous (v2)
    - C Analogy of flourishing for the righteous (v3)
    - C'- Analogy of destitution for the ungodly (v4)
  - B'- Dwelling prohibited to the ungodly (v5)
- A'- General contrast between righteous and ungodly future tense (v6)

# C. Exposition of Psalm 1

#### v1 - What the blessed avoid

Blessed *is* the man

Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly,

Nor stands in the path of sinners,

Nor sits in the seat of the scornful;

# v2 - Where the blessed stay

But his delight is in the law of the Lord,

And in His law he meditates day and night.

#### v3 - What the blessed are like

He shall be like a tree

Planted by the rivers of water,

That brings forth its fruit in its season,

Whose leaf also shall not wither;

And whatever he does shall prosper.

## v4 - What the ungodly are like

The ungodly are not so,

But are like the chaff which the wind drives away.

#### v5 - Where the ungodly cannot be

Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment,

Nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.

#### v6 - What to think about

For the Lord knows the way of the righteous,

But the way of the ungodly shall perish.
