The Peril of Discouragement

The Principle of Peril: A godly life is a perilous life; you will be opposed.

What is peril?

2 Timothy 3:12

1 Peter 5:8-9

Psalm 4:3

Psalm 34:17

A. The Peril of Discouragement (Numbers 11:1-25)

Numbers 10:11-36 - Setting: The Israelites move out from Mount Sinai

Numbers 11:1 - The people complained, and the Lord sent fire to the outskirts of the camp

Numbers 11:2-3 - Moses prayed and the Lord stopped the burning

Numbers 11:4-6 - Intense craving and grumbling

Numbers 11:7-9 - Description of the manna which they complained about

Numbers 11:10-15 - Moses can't handle the problem any more and wants to give up

- Moses was displeased (v10)
- "why have I not found favor in your sight?" (v11)
- "I am not able" (v14)
- "please kill me here and now—if I have found favor in your sight" (v15)

Numbers 11:16-25 – God takes care of His discouraged friend

Two ways that God comforted Moses:

- God sent help by sending people. (v16-17)
- God reminded Moses of His omnipotence. (v21-23)
