		b.	But, other reasons are given in the Law; namely, that Sabbath keeping would be a of Israel's special relationship with God, and that they would weekly remember their past slavery in Egypt. (Deut. 5:15)
	2.		the Ten Commandments. This argument is inherently flawed. The entire Law of Moses, including the Ten Commandments, were given to alone.
		b.	Also, the Law of Moses does not define

		b.	However, Christians are obligated to keep any law simply because it is in the Old Testament and not annulled in the New Testament. We are not under law in any way. (Romans 6:14, Galatians 5:1-15)
		c.	Counter-argument from silence: Sabbath-keeping is never taught to in the New Testament.
		d.	Holiday celebrations of the Law of Moses are specifically declared to be for Christians. (Romans 14:5-6, Colossians 2:16-17)
