- “This is a faithful saying, and these things I want you to affirm constantly” is certainly a reference to Titus 3:4-7, possibly to all of Titus 2:1-3:7.
  
- Titus 3:8 reiterates the argument that when believers hear about the gospel of grace, they will be taught to live a life of good works.
  
- Titus 3:8 stresses that these gospel-fueled works are good and worthwhile.
