### II. THE SUPERIORITY OF CHRIST (Chp1-10)

#### C. CHRIST IS BETTER THAN THE PROPHETS (1:1-3)

#### D. CHRIST IS \_\_\_\_\_ THAN THE \_\_\_\_\_ (1:4-14)

- The writer's *precept*: (vs4) ... Christ ... "having become... (via His incarnation & victory on Calvary) ...is so much \_\_\_\_\_!"
- How is this precept supported by the writer?
  5. He, by inheritance as the Son of God, has a more \_\_\_\_\_ than they! (1:4)
  6. Christ has a superior \_\_\_\_\_ with the Father vs. the angels! (1:5; Psalm 2:7; 2 Samuel 7:14)
  7. Christ is superior as He is God's "\_\_\_\_\_". For when He appears in the world, God's angels \_\_\_\_\_! (1:6; Psalm 89:27)
  8. Christ is better than the angels as He \_\_\_\_\_ angels to be His \_\_\_\_\_ (1:7 & 14; Psalm 104:4)
