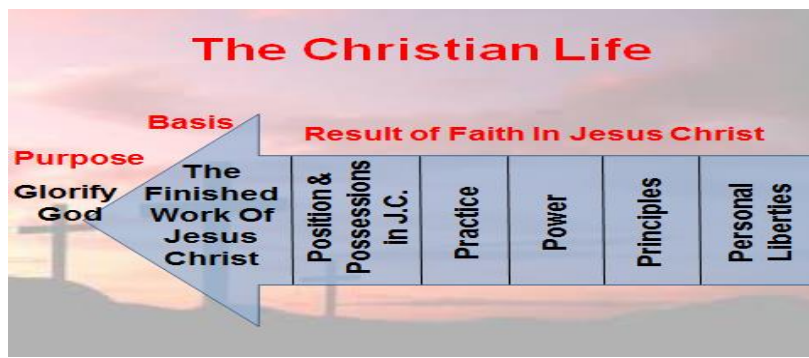

ROMANS 14

Instruction / Application: Receive one who is weak in the faith, but not to disputes over doubtful things. (14:1)

- Some needed clarification about these issues:

Example #1: For one believes he may eat all things, but he who is weak eats only vegetables. (14:2)

Warnings about how NOT to handle these differences: (14:3)

- 1) Let not him who eats despise him who does not eat, and
- 2) let not him who does not eat judge him who eats; **Why?** for God has received him.

Question: Who are you to judge another's servant? (14:4a) **Answer:** To his own master he stands or falls. Indeed, he will be made to stand, for God is able to make him stand. (14:4b)

Example #2: One person esteems one day above another; another esteems every day alike.

Instruction / Application: Let each be fully convinced in his own mind. (14:5)

Bottom Line Issue #1 in an area of liberty and conscience (14:6-9):

He who observes the day, observes it to the Lord;

and he who does not observe the day, to the Lord he does not observe it.

He who eats, eats to the Lord, for he gives God thanks;

and he who does not eat, to the Lord he does not eat, and gives God thanks. 7

For none of us lives to himself, and no one dies to himself. 8

For if we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord.

Therefore, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. 9

For to this end Christ died and rose and lived again, that He might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

Bottom Line Issue #2 in an area of liberty and conscience (14:10-12):

Question #2: But why do you judge your brother? (14:10a)

Question #3: Or why do you show contempt for your brother? (14:10b)

Reason: For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. (14:10c) **Scriptural support:** For it is written: "As I live, says the LORD, Every knee shall bow to Me, And every tongue shall confess to God." (14:11)

Conclusion: So then each of us shall give account of himself to God. (14:12)

Bottom Line Issue #3 in an area of liberty and conscience (14:13-17): Therefore let us not judge one another anymore, but rather resolve this, not to put a stumbling block or a cause to fall in our brother's way. (14:13)

Biblical Principle: I know and am convinced by the Lord Jesus that there is nothing unclean of itself;

Observation #1: but to him who considers anything to be unclean, to him it is unclean. (14:14)

Observation #2: Yet if your brother is grieved because of your food, you are no longer walking in love. (14:15a)

Instruction / Application: Do not destroy with your food the one for whom Christ died. (14:15b)

Warning: Therefore do not let your good be spoken of as evil; (14:16) **Reason:** for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

Bottom Line Issue #4 in an area of liberty and conscience (14:18): For he who serves Christ in these things is acceptable to God and approved by men. (14:18)
